

Physics & Astronomy Student Computer Account Agreement

All Internet usage may be monitored to ensure BYU Honor Code compliance. Viewing pornography is an addictive and spiritually destructive activity; help us stamp out pornography use. Don't view it. The Physics & Astronomy Department has a policy that prohibits viewing illegal or pornographic material from its computer and network resources. If you have a problem with pornography or another addiction, there are several on-campus resources available to help you overcome this problem: 1. Counseling & Career Center (1500 WSC, 422-3035) – this center provides licensed therapists at no charge to BYU students to help with a variety of problems. Therapy is confidential and private. 2. Comprehensive Clinic (244 TLRB, 422-7759) – this clinic provides therapy through graduate students in the field of psychology. Therapy is confidential and private. 3. Your BYU Bishop. The BYU Space Management Office (422-3035) can give you the phone number of your BYU Bishop. Your bishop can be a great help in overcoming many problems.

Creation and use of a Physics computer account signifies you have read and agree to the following terms:

- Your user name will be your BYU NetID and your initial password will be **p@ssword**. The first time you log in you will be prompted to change your password. Passwords must be at least **eight** characters in length. If you are renewing your account your user name and password will remain the same.
- A network P-drive is mapped when you log in at a Physics domain computer. There is no hard limit to the amount of space you are allowed; however, excessive or frivolous use will result in quota enforcement.
- Your **Documents** folder is stored on your P-drive. Anything saved in your Documents will be available on any domain computer in the department and is automatically backed up.
- You can access your P-drive from off-campus using WebDAV. Instructions for using this protocol can be found on the Physics Computer Support website. **FTP access is not provided.**
- The computers in the labs may be reinstalled frequently and without warning. **The hard drive and the Desktop are subject to erasure at any time.** Always store any important data in your Documents or P-drive folder.
- You are responsible for all usage of your computer account. **DO NOT share your password!** If you are going to leave a computer with your account logged in, first lock the computer (press **Ctrl+Alt+Delete** and select **Lock Computer**).
- In the student labs (N212 and N337) you will be **automatically logged off after 30 minutes of inactivity.** Please log out if you will be away from a computer for more than about 20 minutes so that others may use it. **Those who are repeatedly logged off automatically may have their account disabled.**
- Food and drink are **not allowed** in N212 but are permitted in N337. However, **students will be held financially accountable** for any damage incurred as a result of eating or drinking near computer equipment.
- If you are experiencing a problem with a computer, please report it to the CSR office by going to <http://www.physics.byu.edu/ComputerSupport/trouble>. If the problem is urgent, you may call the CSR office at **422-6776**, or come by our office at **N362 ESC**.
